Accredited Degrees

Bethel University is a private, Christian university that holds the full power of accredited degrees in multiple fields of study. Students can participate in hands-on learning through a practicum or internship experience.

Affordability

Our program is uniquely priced at a flat rate of \$10,500 per year for full time. Financial aid is also available for those who qualify.

Flexibility

Students complete classes at your local church/organization partner. Classes are offered in a variety of formats (online or in-person) depending on availability and interest each seven weeks. Many students flex their schedules to work, take classes, and volunteer each week.

THREE STEPS TO BU-X

After you have been approved by your extension site, Student Services will meet with you 3 times to assist you through each step of the process.



ADMISSION MEETING

Student services will schedule a 30-45 minute meeting to walk you through the application and help you request all other required documents.



FINANCIAL AID MEETING

A financial aid meeting will be scheduled at the end of your enrollment meeting. This meeting will discuss your estimated costs, your financial aid needs, and how to apply for aid, including a FAFSA workshop, if you choose.



REGISTRATION MEETING

Your final meeting will be with your academic advisor. During this meeting you will schedule your classes for the upcoming semester.



MEET THE STUDENT SERVICES TEAM The people who will walk you through the process from start to finish.

Becki is your first point of contact when applying to Bethel University through the Extension Studies program, and she will work with you on your application as you complete your file.

Branden oversees the student services function of the program with pastoral care working with students from enrollment through the financial aid application. Branden serves as a primary advisor for the BU-X program.

Why 3 steps?

Student Services wants to help take the stress out of the enrollment process and remove as many barriers to starting college as possible. This is why we have implemented "3 Steps to Joining BU-X." Following approval by your Site Director, we will contact you to schedule an enrollment meeting. During this meeting we will work alongside you to complete the admission application and request any additional documentation needed for your admission file. Our goal is to conclude this meeting having completed or started everything needed to get you ready for an acceptance decision! Equal attention and guidance are provided through the financial aid and advising meetings. In addition to explaining what kind of aid is available, we will help you apply and financially plan for the upcoming semester. Finally, we will introduce you to your Academic Advisor who will meet with you to schedule classes. We recommend joining these meetings from a laptop or desktop, whenever possible. We also encourage and welcome your parent(s) to participate in these meetings.

FAQs for Student Admission

WHO SHOULD APPLY TO BU-X?

BU-X is for all high school graduates and interested young adults who look to discover and embrace their God-given mission within a platform of vocational ministry or the marketplace.

WHAT IS BU-X?

BU-X is a network of sites where students attend to take online courses from Bethel University (Indiana) so that they can stay involved in their local community, church or organization. Some courses will feature a online plus model where professors teach live over Zoom, while other courses will be work at your own pace each week. In addition to coursework, many sites offer leadership training, practical experience and engaging activities for college-aged students.

WHAT STUDENT ACTIVITIES ARE AVAILABLE?

This varies by site and location, but each site may offer volunteer opportunities on a monthly basis, group outings and social gatherings.

WHAT ARE CLASSES LIKE?

BU-X courses are Christ-centered and vibrant, exhibiting a missional focus that matches the ministry of the local site. Courses are offered in either a 7week (accelerated) or 14-week format. Each week's work must be completed before moving on to the next week. Students will be part of a supportive student community where learning is upbeat and positive.

WHAT DOES A TYPICAL WEEK LOOK LIKE AT BU-X?

Students have scheduled classes and academic activities for approximately 3-4 days per week to work on coursework and engage in spiritual formation. Students may also participate in practicum experiences, small groups or other student activities as coordinated by each site.

WHO IS TEACHING THE CLASSES?

Bethel University will provide a quality curriculum taught by Bethel-hired faculty. Students complete classes at your local site. Classes will be offered in a variety of formats including online, online plus and inperson depending on availability and interest in each seven-week session.

CAN I TRANSFER CREDITS?

Dual-credit or college-level credits earned require that a student submits all transcripts prior to acceptance for an official review process. Yes, any credits from a regionally accredited college or university would generally transfer. For more questions, please visit <u>Bethel's Transfer Credit Policy page.</u>

WHAT DEGREE DO I RECEIVE WHEN I FINISH?

There are both two-year associate degrees and fouryear bachelor's degrees available from Bethel University. Practicum experiences are available and offer valuable life experience, leadership development and ministry training from serving with a local business, ministry or organization.

HOW CAN I PAY FOR CLASSES THROUGH BU-X?

Because BU-X degrees are regionally accredited, financial aid is available to those who qualify. Students who complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) may be eligible for the Federal Pell Grant and Federal Direct Loan programs. Additionally, monthly payment plans are available to many students with out-of-pocket tuition costs. For more information, please visit <u>Bethel's Financial Aid page</u>.

HOW CAN I APPLY?

Students are admitted in either the fall (classes begin in August) or spring (classes begin in January) semesters. Students declare their intention to the local site. Then, after approval, students apply to Bethel University by selecting BU-X as their program of choice.

ONLINE AND ONLINE+ CLASSES

Students will be in a variety of course modalities through Bethel's offerings. Students may have a combination of asynchronous and synchronous classes.

ONLINE (Asynchronous): Some students will be enrolled in courses that are "at your own pace" with typical deadlines being on Wednesdays and Saturdays. An online week runs from Sunday morning to Saturday night.

ONLINE+ (Synchronous): Some courses are run with a LIVE ZOOM session, partially live at another location where students join at a set two-hour time frame.

HOW A SEMESTER WORKS

SESSION A (1ST 7 WEEKS)

1 WEEK BREAK SESSION B (2ND 7 WEEKS) Class 3

SESSION C (FULL 14 WEEKS) Class 5 Semester-long course with the same one week break in the middle.

ACCELERATED CLASSES

Yes, classes are accelerated; however, in this model with the support from each site students are being successful with the shortened classes. Students take only 2-3 courses for a 7-week session; therefore, it is a high focus, high intensity for a short time frame. Students must take at least 12 credit hours to be considered full time. Dropping below that number may affect a student's financial aid.

START YOUR EXTENSION SITE



2 + 2 YEAR DEGREES

Students can begin these degrees at their extension sites by completing two years' worth of coursework toward the degree. Students would simply major in the A.A. in General Studies, the A.A. in Ministry Leadership, or the A.A. in General Studies - Pre-Education. These degrees overlap with the Bethel Core of general education courses that students are required to take as a part of their educational path with Bethel. After two years, students would transition to taking courses at Bethel's main campus.

DON'T WAIT, START YOUR DEGREE NOW!

Students would have a huge cost savings for the first two years of their degree by taking online courses at the extension sites. Then, students would be able to transition to Bethel to take the remaining courses to finish their degree. The cost savings would derive from the lower cost the first two years of their degree and by staying embedded within their local community and church. Additionally, extension site students are already Bethel students, so the transition process is smooth!





BU-X is a flat-rate tuition for up to 17 credit hours per semester. Some courses require additional fees.

Wees PRE-EDUCATION

This affordable degree track is a 2+2 program designed for students to complete the first two years at an extension site. The goal of the A.A. is to foster students' ability to think deeply, give them appropriate exposure to a K-12 classroom, and prepare them to finish their bachelor's degree in education. The degree is especially well-poised to appeal to students who have an interest in education, while allowing them experiences to determine their area of specialty within the field of education.

PRE-LAW

The Pre-Law major is designed to afford students a diverse education covering different fields that will prepare a student for a legal education. Law schools look to candidates who have a broad-based education which can cover several disciplines. This kind of diversified education teaches students skills needed for the LSAT and a legal education rather than specific knowledge on a single subject. The major will also help students develop an understanding of ethical patterns and professional conduct in the study of law from a Christian perspective.

BI-VOCATIONAL MINISTRY

The Bi-vocational Ministry major prepares graduates for serving in ministry while simultaneously working in another field. Many churches nationwide are moving toward employing bivocational pastors who lead the church while also working another job. This major provides a strong foundation in biblical study, theology, teaching/preaching, evangelism, and discipleship and enables a student to prepare for work in another vocational field. Students completing this supplemental major must also complete another full major for a bachelor's degree during their studies at Bethel. The bivocational ministry major pairs well with most other majors on campus, including communication, business, marketing, theater, and graphic design.

1 ADMISSION

Our admission counselor(s) will help each student complete the admissions process. The admission process follows our easy, 3-step process.

FINANCIAL AID 2

We have a financial aid counselor(s) who will help guide students through the process of financial aid or student loans.

STUDENT ACCOUNTS 3

The Student Accounts team keeps students' bills up-to-date and provides services (primarily through Nelnet) for managing monthly payments and refunds.

REGISTRAR 4

Once transcripts are submitted, the Registrar evaluates them to make sure they are complete. The Registrar's office also evaluates to look for any dual-credit or college credit a student may have previously earned.

ACADEMIC ADVISING 5

Our academic advisors help students to understand classes available to them. They walk students through selecting appropriate courses as well as completing an application for graduation.
