PARENT CORNER TODAY: DECEMBER 21-22 Weekly

Bible Story: Jesus is Born Luke 2:1-20

Big Idea: Jesus is God's greatest gift.

Focus: Jesus is God's greatest gift and was born to rescue me from my sins.

Memory Verse: "Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you. He is the Messiah, the Lord." *Luke 2:11 (NIrV)*

Bible Story Summary:

Read and meditate on Luke 2:1-20.

In Luke 2, the promised Savior is here! Mary and Joseph traveled to Bethlehem, and Mary gave birth to a baby boy. A large group of angels appeared to shepherds and announced that Jesus had been born. They said that this was good news of great joy. Jesus was the Savior. After the angels went away, the shepherds rushed to see the baby. They praised God for all He had done and shared what they had seen and heard. Mary treasured all of these things in her heart.

Jesus is God's greatest gift. Because of Jesus, it's possible for us to have a relationship with God that will last forever. Jesus came to rescue us from our sins! He truly is God's greatest gift. As we remember the Christmas story, we take time to celebrate the greatest gift the world has ever known...Jesus...God with us!

He Question: Why did Jesus come as a baby?

Jesus could have come to Earth as a king or a warrior, but He humbled Himself to come as a tiny baby. He lived a full human life, experiencing all the same things we do. Jesus came to rescue us.

We Question: How can a baby save us from our sins?

Jesus grew up and lived a perfect life. He died on the cross to take the punishment for our sin. He rose again, defeating death and making a way for us to live with God forever.

Me Question: What does this mean for my life?

I can be forgiven of my sin and a part of God's family by accepting what Jesus did for me on the cross and allowing Him to be the Lord of my life.



Read John 3:16 together. Talk about what this verse has to do with Christmas. God loved the world (and us) so much He sent Jesus to the world on Christmas. Jesus was the best gift of love ever given!







READ "Here is what God says about His Son. God has given us eternal life. And this life is found in His son." 1 John 5:11

Why did God send Jesus to earth that first Christmas? What was the reason for His generosity? Because, God loves us, and people who love, give.

We aren't perfect. We do things that are wrong. We sin. That sin separates us from God, and we can't do enough good things to somehow make up for it. We can't earn our way into God's family. So God sent Jesus as a baby, to grow up on the earth and show us what He is like. And then Jesus paid the ultimate price and took the punishment for our sin. Jesus died on the cross so that we could have a relationship with Him forever. What an amazing gift.

With the help of a parent, draw a cross on a piece of paper, or make a cross out of two sticks. Put it somewhere around your Christmas decorations to remind you this week the reason Jesus came to earth.

LOOK for ways to tell others about the gift of Jesus this Christmas.



READ "God so loved the world that He gave His one and only son. Anyone who believes in Him will not die but will have eternal life." John 3:16
