Bible Story: Jesus' Temptation Luke 4:1-15

Big Idea: Jesus is fully God and fully man

Focus: Jesus never sinned but He understands our temptation

Memory Verse: The Word became a human being. He made his home with us. We have seen his glory. *John 1:14a (NIrV)*

Bible Story Summary:

Read and meditate on Luke 4:1-15

This month, all our stories reveal how Jesus is both God and man. Jesus grew up as a human kid learning about God but also amazing everyone with His godly wisdom. Jesus faced temptations just like any human, but He resisted them and proved His divine strength and authority. Jesus explained to Nicodemus that to have eternal life, Nicodemus needed to believe in Him as God's Son. Jesus forgave sins and healed a paralyzed man, demonstrating His divine power and authority, while also showing His compassion and care as a human.

In Luke 4, Jesus was 30 years old, and He began His ministry. After being baptized by His cousin, John, Jesus was led into the wilderness to face temptations from the devil. The devil, God's enemy, tempted Jesus. But Jesus stayed true to God's Word, resisting the devil's lies. After overcoming these trials, Jesus continued teaching about God's kingdom.

He Question: Did Jesus ever sin?

No, because He is fully God, Jesus is perfect and holy. He never disobeyed God in any way.

We Question: How can Jesus help us when we are tempted to sin? Because Jesus was fully human, He understands our temptations. He shows us mercy and grace and provides a way out.

Me Question: What does God want me to know about Him, and what does this mean for my life?

Give your kids the opportunity to reflect on the truth they learned about God and respond accordingly.



As you eat a meal together, go around the table and have each family member describe a time lately that they felt tempted to do something they weren't supposed to do. Take a moment to pray that God will help them when they feel tempted.







READ "The Word became a human being. He made his home with us. We have seen his glory. John 1:14a (NIrV)

READ Luke 4:1-15 (NIrV)

In our story this week, we learned how Jesus was led into the wilderness to face temptations from the Devil. The devil, God's enemy, tempted Jesus. But Jesus stayed true to God's Word, resisting the devil's lies. After overcoming these trials, Jesus continued teaching about God's kingdom.

Have a parent or sibling think of a word from today's story. Don't have them say the word out loud. In the space to the right, have them draw a blank for each letter of the word. Then, guess a letter that you think is in the word. If you correctly guess a letter, have them write it in the correct blank. If you guess a letter incorrectly, have them draw one piece of a stickman in the blank area below. See if you can guess the word before the stickman is complete!

READ Matthew 4:1-11(NIrV)

Think about a time you did something you weren't supposed to do. We all have been tempted to do things that are not right. But knowing what God says can help us make the wise choice!

With the help of a parent, draw a picture of a time you were tempted to do something you were not supposed to do.

Look at that picture this week and remember that just like Jesus, God can help you resist temptation.
