Big Idea: Jesus came to be our Savior.

Life App: Easter - Celebrating that Jesus is alive.

Bible Story Summary:

Read and meditate on Matthew 21:1-22.

We kick off Easter week with the story of Palm Sunday as described in Matthew 21:1-11. By this time, God's people had been waiting hundreds of years for God's promised Savior. As Jesus' ministry grew, the people were starting to believe that Jesus WAS that Savior. They were sure that God's promises were finally coming true! So, when Jesus entered Jerusalem on a donkey, just like a prophecy foretold, the people celebrated and worshiped Him. And while they might not have fully understood how Jesus was about to make peace, they could celebrate because God was faithful to send a Savior.

Jesus came to be our Savior. Jesus was more than a good teacher and miracle worker. Jesus is God's very own Son. God promised that Jesus would come and save us from the consequences of our sin. When Jesus came, He fulfilled all of the promises that God made. On top of that, Jesus is the Savior we all need to have a forever relationship with God. We pray that all kids choose to trust Jesus as their Savior this Faster season.

Today's verses are all about Palm Sunday! It is called Palm Sunday because the branches cut down were palm branches. Jesus fulfilled what the prophet Zechariah said would happen by riding in on a donkey and her colt. The people thought that Jesus was coming to save them from the Roman government, but Jesus was coming to be the Savior for everyone's sins, which is much greater.

DAY 2

READ "The Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world. We have seen it and are witnesses to it." 1 John 4:14

Jesus came to be our Savior! When we stop and think about it, Jesus has done so much for us. With a parent, talk about some of the ways you have seen Jesus in your life and in the lives of others.

DAY 3

READ "God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son. Anyone who believes in Him will not die but will have eternal life." John 3:16

God made people, and people sinned. Instead of listening to God, we decided to do things our own way. Because God loves us, Jesus came to fix that problem. DAY 4

READ "the Son of Man came to look for the lost and save them." Luke 19:10

With your family, play 2 rounds of hide and seek now! The first round, you hide and in the second round, you seek!

What's the goal of Hide and Seek? To find all the people hiding! That's what Jesus came to do for us! Without Jesus, we are lost and our connection with God is broken. So, God sent Jesus to "find" and rescue us.

You might be thinking, "What do I need to be rescued from?" The short answer is sin. Sin is anything that makes God sad. When we know what the right thing to do is and we don't do it, we sin. Our sin gets in the way of our relationship with God. Jesus' death on the cross took the punishment for sin and when He rose again, He made a way for us to be forgiven. Jesus came to be our Savior!
