Bible Story: Let It Go (Jacob & Esau Meet Again) Genesis 27:41-45; 31:3,

32:1-21: 33:1-11 Big Idea: It's better to let go than get even.

Memory Verse: : "So let us do all we can to live in peace. And let us work

hard to build up one another." Romans 14:19 (NIrV)

Life App: Peace - Proving you care more about each other than winning an

argument.

Bible Story Summary:

Read and meditate on Genesis 27, 32-33.

In Genesis 27, 32, and 33, we hear the story of two brothers: Jacob and Esau. When Jacob stole Esau's birthright and blessing, Esau was furious. Years later, the brothers meet again, and this time Esau lets go of his anger and chooses to love his brother.

Peace is part of God's character. He wants us to reflect peace in our relationships with others. Peace is proving you care more about each other than winning an argument. It is more than just "not fighting" and saving the right things to keep people happy. Peace is living in a way that shows you care more about others than about being right, even when it means letting go of what seems fair.

Our memory verse this month is: "So let us do all we can to live in peace. And let us work hard to build each other up." Romans 14:19, NIrV. Doing all we can to live peaceably might include sacrificing what ought to be ours. But ultimately, we will show the peace of Jesus to the world.





As a family, think about what all there is to do for the day. Maybe there is work or school, soccer practice or dance, or maybe you need to do a lot of chores around the house. Discuss if there might be a situation during those events that could make it difficult to show peace. Together, come up with ways to react with peace to help everyone be prepared for the day!







READ Genesis 33:3-4

Who were Jacob and Esau? Friends **Brothers**

What happened in today's verse?

Esau refused to speak to Jacob. Jacob hid forever from Esau. Esau made peace with Jacob.

Jacob and Esau were brothers. Jacob stole Esau's birthright, which was a BIG deal back then. It meant that Jacob stole Esau's ability to be the leader of the family and receive the family's money when their parents died. Esau was very angry at Jacob, and so Jacob hid for many years away from his brother before returning home. When he did, Esau chose to let it go instead of getting even and made peace with Jacob!

You can do the same thing. Even when you are frustrated, upset, or hurt by what someone did to you, you have a choice like Esau did. You can stay mad and plan to get even, or you can choose peace and move on.

READ "If possible, live in peace with _____. Do that as much as you can." Romans 12:18

Take a moment and read the verse again. Live in peace with...EVERYONE? But what about those kids that aren't nice to anyone?

This verse is saying that we should do everything we can to live in peace with others, and that includes people that may not always act the way we think they should. You may not be able to control the actions of others, but you can control your reactions. Responding with peace, choosing to let go instead of getting even, allows you to show kindness even when it is difficult.

Think about your day. Was there something that happened that you felt was unfair? Maybe the whole class got in trouble because one person was talking, or your parents asked you to do a chore even though your sibling has not done anything to help. How did you react? Think about how you can respond with peace and focus on choosing to let go instead of getting even tomorrow.

REMEMBER for opportunities to choose peace instead of getting even.

READ "If you do not judge other people, then you will not be judged. If you do not find others guilty, then you will not be found guilty. Forgive, and you will be forgiven." Luke 6:37

We mess up all the time. We lie, say unkind things, and complain to our parents, and disobey the list goes on and on. But guess what? God forgives us. And because God shows us forgiveness for our mistakes, we can show others forgiveness. When we let go instead of choosing to get even, we are showing others forgiveness.

It can be difficult to respond with kindness when something is unfair to you. But, when you remember that God forgives you, it can be easier to show that person forgiveness. Taking a moment to talk to God and pray can help you respond with kindness and choose peace, even when it is hard.

Take some time to talk to God now, thanking Him for the forgiveness He shows you and ask Him to help you show forgiveness to others.
