Bible Story: Jesus Is Promised Isaiah 9:6-7

Big Idea: Jesus is God's greatest gift.

Focus: Jesus is God's greatest gift and was promised a long time ago.

Memory Verse: "Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to

you. He is the Messiah, the Lord. Luke 2:11 NIrV

Bible Story Summary:

Read and meditate on the book of Isaiah 9: 6-7

From the time of Adam and Eve's sin, our world has been broken. From that time, all throughout the Old Testament, God promised He would send a Rescuer to save His people from sin. God sent prophets to share His messages of hope. Isaiah is one of those prophets. He tells us that the long awaited Savior is comina.

Jesus is the fulfillment of God's plan. Because of Jesus, it's possible for us to have a relationship with God that will last forever. As we remember the Christmas story, we take time to celebrate the greatest gift the world has ever known, Jesus.

He Question: What did God promise?

Throughout the Old Testament, God made covenants with Abraham and David and their children. He promised He would send a Rescuer who would save the people from their sin.

We Question: Why would we trust God to keep His promises?

Everything God says is true. The Old Testament has hundreds of prophecies of Jesus coming as the Rescuer. They all came true.

Me Question: What does this mean for my life?

I can always trust God to keep His promises. And I know that God sent Jesus to be the rescuer of my sins so I can be a part of His family.





As you drive, discuss how God had promised to send a Savior, and he kept that promise when Jesus came on Christmas. Play a game where every time you see a Christmas decoration, you try to be the first to name the decoration and vell, "Thank You, God for Jesus!"







READ "He is the Lord our God. He judges the whole earth. He will keep his covenant forever. He will keep His promise for all time to come." Psalm 105:7-8 (NirV)

God is our creator, our heavenly Father, and our place of safety. God sent Jesus on that first Christmas because He loves us more than we can imagine. Through the prophet Isaiah, God promised to send His Son to rescue us, and He followed through on that promise! God ALWAYS keeps His promises.
