Monday

READ: Ephesians 4:26-27

REFLECT: Anger is not a sin in itself, but uncontrolled anger can often lead to disastrous consequences. This passage describes the nature and the limits of biblical anger. When we don't control our anger, use it in the wrong way, or allow it to fester, it can consume us. It is creating space for Satan to come in and lead us astray.

RESPOND: Ask God to reveal to you if you are harboring anger in your heart. If He reveals any anger in you, then ask Him to transform your heart and seek another believer for help.

Tuesday

READ: Mark 3:1-6

REFLECT: In this situation, Jesus was angry because the worshipers and religious leaders did not answer His question of whether it was right for Him to heal on the Sabbath. Jesus was angry at those whose hearts were hard toward this man in need. His anger is the necessary expression of His love for this suffering man.

RESPOND: In what ways are you treating religious tradition as more important than people? Ask God to reveal this to you and ask how you can avoid doing this in your heart.

Wednesday

READ: John 2:13-17

REFLECT: In this time, people could bring their own animals for sacrifices. Sometimes these animals were considered unworthy so people would have to buy animals at exorbitant prices. This was especially hurtful to the poor because they could not afford these prices and, therefore, were hindered in worshiping God. This greatly angered Jesus.

RESPOND: How does your anger reflect your love for others? How can you use your anger to act on the behalf of those who can't act for themselves?

Thursday

READ: Proverbs 14:29

REFLECT: While there is righteous anger, there is also foolish anger. This proverb describes how the one who shows patience is the one who has wisdom and the one who is not patient and wants to hurry to judgment of others is acting foolish.

RESPOND: Are you more prone to be patient or foolish in your anger? Spend some time reflecting on this question and ask God to guide you in using your anger in a patient way.

Friday

READ: James 1:19-20

REFLECT: Rather than being quick to listen, slow to speak and become angry, we often are quick to speak and become angry and slow to listen. Then, our anger does not achieve what we want. It actually accomplishes the exact opposite. When we allow God to direct our responses, we will see Him work in amazing ways that accomplish what He desires.

RESPOND: Ask God to accomplish what your anger cannot. Ask Him to grow your patience and willingness to listen to what others say.
